

PROJECT PHULWARI

roject PHULWARI is an initiative of Humanity Welfare Council in the field of child care and development. Anganwadi centres are very popular among local people and if properly utilised can help in resolving many issues among children.

Project PHULWARI recognises these Anganwadi Centres (AWCs) as the most important unit in society development. We aim to act as the backbone of such centres by providing them assistance in meeting their targets and thus making the ICDS programme and the efforts of the Indian Government successful. Project PHULWARI lays emphasis on holistic development of children. The focus is on children from age group 0 years-5 years which is a period of physical and mental growth. This project is specially designed to reach disadvantaged and low income groups. The project is aimed to break an intergenerational cycle of under nutrition which leads to lower cognitive development, which results in lower learning capacities.

A study found that Anganwadi's running under ICDS programme is not particularly effective in reducing malnutrition, largely because of implementation problems. Humanity Welfare Council is trying to fulfil this gap. Legislative policy, plan and programme commitments including a range of national programmes to improve early child development outcomes remain a real challenge. Certainly there is a need for higher investment, greater commitment at all levels besides application in terms of design, delivery and development to restore overall growth and development of children.

Housing is one of the basic requirements of human beings. Adequate shelter for each and every household is a fundamental pre-requisite for a healthy living in any society. From a social point of view a house provides significant economic security and status in society. For a homeless person a house brings about a profound social change in his existence, endowing him with an identity. A house or shelter, how so ever serves all aspect of basic need of poor households without which it is difficult to survive. It provides them both physical and mental strength and psychological base on which they can fall back while accessing other basic needs such as food, clothing, etc. For a poor household, a house constitutes an asset that can be offered as a collateral security for a loan during difficult periods. A house also protects a poor household from the vagaries of nature, in the absence of which they are forced to take to streets and live in open. Apart from a house provides security to people. Desire to have a shelter of any kind devoid of sanitary facilities can well be observed in urban areas, where the slums exist for providing shelter to the people of lower income groups.

lectricity generated through coal plants is becoming expensive day by day. Power cuts and increasing dependence on DG sets is causing a lot of damage to the environment. The demand supply gap for electricity is increasing in the country which makes it very important for people to start thinking of other ways of realizing their energy needs.

India is faced with the challenge of sustaining its rapid economic growth while dealing with global threat of climate change. There are some observed changes in climate parameters in India too, like increase in surface temperature by 0.4 °C, variation in monsoon patterns, rise in sea levels by 1.06-1.75mm per year, extreme weather conditions breaking over 130 years records, Erratic water flow in perennial rivers originating from Himalayas. Alongside, the fast depleting conventional sources of power generation have worsened the situations of energy crisis.

Key Points

- Providing access to a minimal supply of clean energy – enough to power two LED lights for a few hours and charge a mobile phone – is probably not enough to significantly improve people's lives.
- A study has revealed that homes that had received basic access to clean electricity for the first time, have spent less on expensive kerosene for lighting, a benefit to families and environment.



 Access to a couple hours a day of electricity was not enough to boost savings, help launch new businesses, increase time spent working or studying, or otherwise significantly improve people's lives.

Project BLUE SHOWER means conservation of water by promoting Rainwater harvesting systems, building wells, water tanks and other such systems. Rainwater harvesting is a simple method by which rainfall is collected, stored, utilised in different ways or directly used for recharge purposes. With depleting groundwater levels and fluctuating climate conditions, Rainwater harvesting can go a long way to help mitigate these effects. Capturing the rainwater can help recharge local aquifers, reduce urban flooding and most importantly ensure water availability in water scarce zones. Though the term seems to have picked up greater visibility in the last few years, it was, and is even today, a traditional practice followed in rural India.

This water conservation method can be easily practiced in individual homes, apartments, parks, offices and temples too, across the world. Farmers have recharged their dry bore wells, created water banks in drought areas, green farms, increased sustainability of their water resources and even created a river.

Project RASOI is an initiative by Humanity Welfare Council to promote community kitchen. To begin with, community kitchens are not only a food security measure for those who cannot fend for themselves (e.g., the elderly, ill, disabled, destitute, etc.). In fact, such initiatives are equally important for working people in urban areas (from rickshaw pullers to delivery boys who are on the road the whole day) as a source of inexpensive and nutritious food. This is amply evident outside the All India Institute of Medical Sciences in Delhi at meal times. The queues for free meals served by charitable bodies can be up to a kilometre long.

Such kitchens can also be viewed as a response to market failures where street food is concerned. Many urban poor do not have much option but to rely on street food. When there are price spikes (in recent times dal, onions before that), the poor are often the hardest hit. Community kitchens can provide relief at such times by offering food at fixed prices.

BUNDELKHAND

backward region is the most backward region of the country with grim face of poverty. Due to its distinctive geographical features the region has many disadvantages which makes it backward socially economically and industrially.

Humanity Welfare Council has chosen Bundelkhand region for Phase 1 of its development programmes. The research team of HWC closely studied the factors behind the backwardness of the region and found that some of the factors are natural but, most of the factors are anthropogenic. Some of the findings are as follows-

- Poor resource based
- Low and unreliable rainfall
- Infertile Land
- Extreme Climatic Conditions
- Illiteracy
- Poor Communication
- Low Industrial growth

Bundelkhand is struck by occurrence of regular scarcity of water which slows down all the course of growth and development as agriculture is the main livelihood of the area. It leads to severe livelihood crisis, escalating helplessness, migration, farmers suicide, child and bondage labour etc.

Based on the above findings humanity welfare Council designed action cum research projects. The programmes of HWC are democratic in nature and are true reflection of people's real aspiration and needs. A common person should indentify and ready to participate in development projects which aim to their social and economic welfare.



To fulfil its objectives HWC will open centres where following services will be provided –

Fundraising Guidelines

hese guidelines are to assist businesses, groups and individuals who are interested in fundraising on behalf of Humanity Welfare Council (HWC), through hosting a Donation Box.

Responsibilities as a fund raiser

As the fund raising organiser, you are also responsible for researching and complying with all State/Territory laws and regulations relating to your fund raising activity. To meet requirements for the use of the Donation Boxes, the following criteria must be met:

- Donation Box (s) must be securely fastened to a counter or bench.
- Donation Box (s) must be emptied and counted at least once a month.
- Only people authorised by HWC may open or count the contents of Donation Box(s) and two people must be present at any opening of the Donation Box and counting of the donations.
- The serial number, which is located on the back of the Donation Box, must be recorded on the reconciliation form and referenced when the funds are banked.

Upholding Humanity Welfare Council standards

All funds raised on behalf of HWC must fit with the aims and values of HWC. Therefore we require that no funds are raised through:

- The promotion of alcohol;
- Any false commitment on behalf of funds;
- Dangerous or high-risk activities

Banking the funds raised

All funds collected from the Donation Boxes can be forwarded to HWC in the form of a bank cheque, personal cheque, bank transfer, credit card or money order made out to HWC, along with a remittance form.
